#### TO ALL THE KIDS WHO SURVIVED THE 1930'S, 40'S 50'S & 60'S

First, we survived being born to mothers who smoked and/or drank while they were pregnant. They took aspirin, ate blue cheese dressing, tuna from a can and didn't get tested for diabetes. Then after that trauma, we were put to sleep on our tummies in baby cribs covered with bright colored lead-base paints.

We had no child proof lids, on medicine bottles, locks on doors or cabinets and when we rode our bikes we had baseball caps not helmets on our heads.

As infants & children, we would ride in cars with no car seats, no booster seats, no seat belts, no air bags, bald tires and sometimes no brakes.

Riding in the back of a pick-up truck on a warm day was always a special treat. We drank water from the garden hose and not from a bottle. We shared one soft drink with four friends, from one bottle and no one actually died from this. We ate cupcakes, white bread, real butter and bacon. We drank Kool-Aid made with real white sugar, And, we weren't overweight.. WHY? Because we were always out side playing... that's why!

We would leave home in the morning and play all day, as long as we were back when the streets lights came on. No one was able to reach us all day, and we were OKAY.

We did not have Play stations, Nintendo's and X-boxes. There were no video games, no 150 channels on cable, no video movies or DVD's, no CD's or cell phones, no personal computors, no internet and no chat rooms. WE HAD FRIENDS and we went outside and found them.

We fell out of trees, got cut, broke bones and teeth and there were no lawsuits from these accidents. We would get spankings with wooden spoons, switches, ping pong paddles, or just a bare hand and no one would call child services to report abuse.

We were given BB guns for our 10th birthday, made up games with sticks and tennis balls and, although we were told it would happen, we did not put out very many eyes. Little league had tryouts and not everyone made the team. Those who didn't had to learn to deal with disappointment. Imagine these generations have produced some of the best risk-taker, problem solvers and inventors ever.

The past 50 years have been an explosion of innovation and new ideas. We had freedom, failure, seccess and responsibility, and we learned how to deal with it all. If you are one of them. CONGRATULATIONS.
