A WONDERFUL JOURNEY



We thoroughly enjoy the FFA's Newsletter. We also felt that perhaps a "snippet" of Janice and Andre Bolaffi's journey together might be of interest particularly since (a) we came from two different worlds and (b) we celebrate September 12th a date that will live in eternity... It is the date of our 68th wedding anniversary. So here goes...

Janice Caen Lerner was born in Boston and grew up on Glenway Street in Dorchester. Massachusetts. She is the second oldest of four daughters born to a Russian Jewish father and an American Jewish mother. She and several other friends founded the Delmar's Club. Janice attended the Sarah Greenwood school and graduated from Girls Latin School in Boston. In 1950 she enrolled in the freshman class at Brandeis University... a brand new University that opened its academic doors in 1948 and had yet to have a graduating class. Janice graduated, Cum Laude, from Brandeis in 1954. Later she graduated from Boston University's graduate school earning a Master's and Ph.D. degrees in Endocrinology.

Andre Bolaffi was born in Cairo, Egypt and raised in both Cairo and Alexandria. He is the only child of a Russian Jewish mother and an Italian Jewish father. He too, later on, went on to Rutgers University where, with the aid of the GI bill, he earned his Master's and Ph.D. degrees in Food Science and Technology.

We met at Brandeis in 1950. One day I (Andre along with my roommate) was in the "chow" line of Brandeis University's cafeteria. Janice was working behind the counter at the dessert station. One look and I was thunder struck with the beauty of her eyes, lips and smile! I told her she was beautiful and asked for her name. Her reply was "you only get one dessert, move on"! 




MY RECOLLECTIONS
